Clinical Oncology Pharmacist

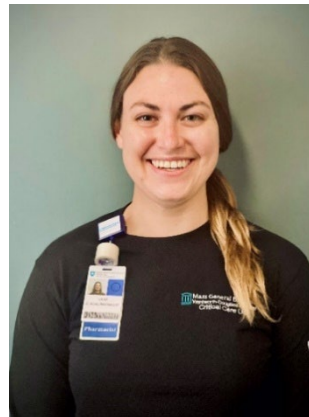
